# LOVE ONE ANOTHER

The season of Easter reminds us that our calling as disciples is to be shepherds in the likeness of Jesus by loving one another. Love is the defining mark of true discipleship, not just a feeling but a way of life that reveals Christ to the world.

Like Paul and Barnabas in the first reading, who endured hardships to proclaim the Gospel of love, this strengthened the disciples by reminding them, "It is necessary for us to undergo many hardships to enter the kingdom of God." Their journey reflects the reality of Christian life, that joy and struggle go hand in hand. However, these trials shape us to shepherd others in faith.

## PSALM:

Shepherding is not just for church leaders but for every believer. We are called to reflect Christ's love in our families, workplaces, and communities, ensuring that love remains at the heart of our witness. For this love speaks of God's mercy and faithfulness, "The Lord is gracious and merciful, slow to anger and of great kindness." (Psalm 145:8-13) This divine love is the foundation of our own call to love one another. As recipients of God's grace, we are to extend it to others, reflecting His everlasting kingdom.

The vision of John in Revelation shows a renewed world where God dwells among His people, wiping away every tear. Love is not just a commandment for today but a glimpse of our eternal future. Every act of kindness and sacrifice rooted in the love of Christ contributes to this greater vision of renewal.

The central message of the gospel delivers Jesus' key commandment: "Love one another. As I have loved you, so you also should love one another." He states that this love will be the true sign of discipleship: "This is how all will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another." This love is not selective or conditional; it mirrors Christ's selfless and sacrificial love. It forgives, it bears burdens, it endures hardships. It is this love that sets believers apart and draws others to Christ.

Prayer is essential in helping us discern what this love looks like in real time. Contemplative silence, reflective prayer to discern God's love and direction, scripture reflection, receiving the Eucharist regularly, and going to confession will give us the grace to love fully.

A clear direct reminder for us to look to Christ daily, our Shepherd who leads us in love. Our joy in Him should be evident not just in words but in action. This may mean checking on a lonely friend or neighbor, offering our forgiveness to a fractured relationship, or being generous with our time for someone in need. Sometimes it is choosing to support our parish or community's mission activities like encounters, LSS, soup kitchen or medical mission. Love within our community gives living witness to our Lord's resurrection. When we gather as a community to serve, encourage, and lift one another, the love of Jesus becomes visible and transforming. It becomes good news in action. When we love as Jesus did, we show the world that Jesus is alive and working through His people and so, we fulfill His promise:

"All will know that you are my disciples if you have love for one another."

As we continue in this Easter season, may we be renewed in our commitment to love one another, so that through us, the world may see and experience the love of Christ.

People who love each other fully and truly are the happiest people in the world. They may have little, they may have nothing, but they are happy people. Everything depends on how we love one another.



Newness Of Gods Love

GOD continues to renew the divine creation. GOD is revealing to us part of the process of making all things new. We can participate in this process by our loving one another as Jesus has loved (and continues to love) us. It means that we must manifest that love by our care and service of others.

The question we must constantly ask ourselves, in every situation we find ourselves, is "How can I bring the newness of GOD's life and love into this situation?" We must contemplate and put into action what it is that we can do to make GOD's presence felt by others (and by ourselves) in each circumstance. It means we must make decision that will not always be easy, but that will further GOD's reign over us and others. We need to be aware of the fresh ruah (breeze, wind, breath, Spirit) blowing into our stuffy lives and then help others to experience that newness through our loving them. When we do that, we will be living out the words of today's psalm: "Let Your faithful ones make known Your might to the children of Adam [including all people], and the glorious splendor of Your reign. Your reign is a reign for all ages, and Your dominion endures through all generations."

The personal question/action for today is: What can I do to bring the newness of GOD's love into a particular situation? Is there a situation today (this week) that can be renewing by my acting in a more loving way? Who needs to experience a sense of renewal that I can help bring about by my loving him/her/them?
