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

In the First reading, Jesus asked his disciples to wait for the promise of the Fa-



ther "...you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes upon you, and you will be my witnesses...to the ends of the earth," (Acts 1:8).

The disciples were witnesses to the passion, death and resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ and they were commissioned by the Lord "to preach repentance and forgiveness of sin in his name," (Lk 24:46). To this day, it is also our mission to spread the Good News of our sal-

vation, not with fear or anxiety but with trust and confidence, as the Holy Spirit moves us. By united prayer and perseverance, we await the power of God and open our hearts to the promptings of the Spirit to rebuild broken relationships, with empathy and compassion. We are called to be like Christ to others and respond lovingly to His bidding to "feed my lamb... tend my sheep... feed my sheep," (cf. Jn 21:15-17).

I renew my particular invitation to my Brothers in the Episcopate, that "in their life and actions they distinguish themselves by a powerful evangelical witness" (Letter proclaiming the Year for Priests) and know also how to use the means of communication wisely to make known the life of the Church and help the men of today to discover the Face of Christ (cf. Message for the 44th World Day of Social Communications, 24 January 2010).
