# " PEACE I LEAVE WITH YOU'

Tonight's Theme is: We are shepherds in the likeness of Jesus when we keep His word and share His peace to all, is all about possessing inner peace and being at peace with others. Meanwhile, tonight's Promise: "The Advocate, the Holy Spirit... will teach you everything and remind you of all that I told you"is Jesus' promise to us of inner peace through the Holy Spirit. As I portray the imagery of the Gospel, I will first describe the backdrop, the emotions that Jesus and His apostles may have felt and finally the message that it imparts. The Gospel is part of Jesus' Farewell Discourse at the Last Supper. It is His parting words to His closest friends of 3 years. Jesus is aware of the events that are about to transpire while the apostles are clueless. From Jesus' standpoint the mood can be best describe by the song, "Time to say Goodbye", sang as a duet by Andrea Bocelli and Sarah Brightman. The lyrics

## PSALM: O God, let all the nations praise you

convey a poignant message about bidding farewell to a beloved person with a sense of deep sadness and the realization that a significant chapter in their relationship is ending. Even though the parting may be necessary; it speaks of the pain of separation while acknowledging the in/e/vita/bility of moving on. This might have been the bittersweet emotion that Jesus felt towards His apostles, but at the same time, the Gospel brought a message of hope at Jesus' invitation, "Whoever loves me will keep my word, and my Father will love him, and we will come to him and make our dwelling with him." (John 14:23) Jesus is telling His beloved disciples that if they love Him, and keep his word, then Jesus will come back to them and live with them in the person of the Holy Spirit. This is the same promise that He is making with us today. Jesus will always be in our hearts. And when we have Jesus, we have peace unlike anything the world can give us. Jesus, follows up his invitation by reassuring us, "Peace I leave with you; my peace I give to you. Not as the world gives do I give it to you." (John 14:27). The Last Supper was essentially Jesus' last will and testament. His promise to us tonight is the same promise He gave to his apostles. Every experience, every teaching, every encounter, every miracle that they have witnessed in the past 3 years with Jesus will come alive as the Holy Spirit dwells in them. Jesus does not promise them a conflict-free, pain-free, or problem-free lives, but He did promise them inner peace.

So let us now delve into what "Peace I Leave with You, My Peace I Give to You" mean. Keep in mind that Jesus spoke these words knowing that his disciples would suffer a great deal. He warned them that they would be beaten, arrested, and otherwise persecuted everywhere they went. Not very reassuring, is it? And yet paradoxically, despite these trials that were yet to come, he promised them great peace.

For many people, peace can mean the absence of conflict or trouble. While this is a definition of peace, that is not what Jesus was talking about. The peace that He offers us is a state of rest, quiet, and stillness in our hearts. It is not the absence of trouble, but it exists in spite of trouble.

This peace pushes through all the disturbing circumstances that life can throw at us. It gives us the ability to endure and be calm even in the face of extreme turmoil. This peace doesn't eliminate conflict or trouble, but gives us the ability to endure through it. Consider it an inner confidence that we know God will come through in any situation. It removes fear and worries and replaces it with tranquility and harmony that comes from trusting in God's grace and power. It is the result of a right relationships with God, others, and creation.

During Mass, the priest tells us "Peace be with you" Hebrew, the word is Shalom which means wholeness with God that is made possible through Jesus. permanent, guaranteed, and eternal.

How do we then obtain this inner peace? First, we Word. Status and wealth may be beneficial, but to spiritual havoc. The soul's primary need is view objects and persons in reference to God. instead cling to His Word. Secondly, we must God. 
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
