

Be On The Lookout For Traps

REFLECTION:

In this Sunday's gospel, three points stand out to me: the first is the word "entrapped", the second is the antagonist in the passage, the Roman emperor at that time named Caesar, whose image is encrypted into the coin that is used for paying



"Entrap" is a biblical metaphor for temptation and sin. A trap is something that stops you, catches you, steals your mobility and purpose, and peace of mind, and delivers you into someone else's control. In the worst-case scenarios, the victim experiences pain and injury, ongoing captivity, and even death. Needless to say, a trap is a wickedly dangerous thing that is to be avoided at all costs.

And yes, there's always that matter of bait. The bait is critical to the success of the trap. And for each of us, there are different kinds of bait that most teasingly tempt us: matters of pride, immorality, en-

vy, appetite, anger, sloth, lack of forgiveness, lack of gratitude, and various combinations of these, which are collectively known as the seven deadly sins.


All bait, however, has this in common: it is never worth it. Bait is always a lie, a false advertisement, a coy

that promises pleasure but delivers only disaster. In our daily conversations today and the current dynamics of the world we live in, we keep running into the minefield of traps in front of us that do not even glorify God. From the spectrum of politics to religious conversations to family and its basic values and traditions, it feels hard to talk about it without some partisan issue coming up. For those of us who want to avoid conflict, it can feel like navigating an impossible maze. And for those of us who want to fight for what we believe is right, the fight is always at our fingertips, never giving us rest. But in essence, these are traps.

How about that tantalizing social media post from one of your friends that tempts you to make senseless comments, that com-

ment made in passing by your spouse or any family member, your neighbors, fellow BLD members, or coworkers that you can't wait to bring up and confront, that non-verbal body language of a person that tempts you to make unhelpful judgments that do not even help you and the world to be a better place, the enticement to compare yourself to others, the resentment and unforgiving heart, and even that imaginary argument that you play in your head that makes you feel that buzz of righteous anger? These are traps. This results in nothing but destruction and broken relationships. They appeal to our selfishness, offering us victory and giving us the power of anger, and yet when it's all done, you feel worse and you entice the others into the trap, and no one grows.

And what is at stake when we face a trap?

Just like Jesus, what is at stake is loyalty. Will you be loyal first and foremost to the convictions, the way of being, and the way of loving that has been shown to us in Jesus or will you give identity, your loyalty, and influence over our behavioral response to some person, cultural or societal norm. Remember, our following Jesus should drive us to hold cultural, societal, political, and ethical convictions because first and foremost, we belong to him and his kingdom whose image is stamped on us.

As believers and followers of Jesus Christ, we travel on a trial-heavy road. Therefore, we must diligently be on the lookout for ensnaring temptations and make sure we are doing everything the Lord has taught us about how-to walk-through life

through his grace such as:

- Make God our priority by following his commandments;
- Faithfully attend Eucharistic celebrations and our Praise and Worship:
- Offer everything you do, say, and think for God's greater glory.

I am sure that there are other ways to glorify God in our life including reading the bible which is a lamp to our feet and a light to our path.

We are told to walk in faith, in love, and in the spirit. We are commanded to put on the armor of God and be ready for the battle. Though traps are all around us, we do not have to be the devil's prey. With the light of the scriptures, the protective providence of the Father, and the indwelling power of the Holy Spirit, we can walk with God in liberty and peace.
