Obedience Requires Humility

REFLECTION:

The theme and promise tonight are a great reminder of our good Lord's patience and love for all of us. He is a forgiving God who constantly waits for us to repent and make right any of our offenses. We are all called to be obedient and committed to His

Holy will. These things are easy to say but very difficult to act on, almost impossible to follow for most of us. We constantly hear this from others and even ourselves: I will be obedient to God's will. I will do His will and not my own. We hear this so much that it has become cliche, it has lost all its meaning; we have grown numb to these promises and statements.

Why do we act like the second son most of the time, why do we continuously say "we love You Lord" and "I will be obedient", but find ourselves doing the exact opposite of His will? Very much like the pharisees, we constantly pray, actively participate in church or community activities but do nothing for our brothers and sisters in need. Just like the pharisees, we have this sense of entitlement, a sense that we deserve to



be saved because we are His 'followers'. Sadly, my brothers and sister, we are far from being His followers. For us to be obedient to His Holy will, we first need to humble ourselves.

At our last final plenary session and during our LWG a few weeks ago, one thing was made clear to me,

obedience does not come without humility. Our hearts are hardened because we lack humility, we prioritize ourselves first instead of our brothers and sisters in need. Our egos and pride get in the way to our obedience to His will. Being full of ourselves has pushed out our Lord and Savior from our hearts. This difficulty to rid ourselves of our selfishness and self-centeredness is the main obstacle that keeps us away from His saving grace.

Our Lord and Savior has given us a multitude of examples of His humble heart. From our second reading tonight: "he humbled himself, becoming obedient to death, even death on a cross." (Phil 2:8) Our Lord Jesus Christ is showing us that true obedience requires true humility, to regard our-
