Jesus Christ, The Gate

REFLECTION:

The 4th Sunday of Easter is known as the Good Shepherd Sunday. Another title is given to Jesus Christ and that is the Gate. He is the Door that leads us to salvation. He is the Way, the Truth and the Life and it is only through Him that we attain the fullness of life; the only path to go to the Father. He desires for us to inherit the kingdom but we must hear His voice and follow Him. "The sheep hear his voice, as he calls

his own sheep by name and leads them..." (cf. Jn 10:3-5). We will follow the voice that is familiar to us, the voice that we are accustomed to hearing. Jesus speaks to us in different ways and we must diligently listen to His voice. We need to practice listening instead of our mind wandering somewhere else. Our sheep pen is full of distractions, temptations and struggles that take away our mind from Christ.



"Be still and know that I am God," (Ps 46:10). When we are silent we concentrate on Jesus' voice through those vibrant narratives of the gospel, the parables and the sacred scriptures which is living and effective. Participating in Lectio Divina helps us to get to know Christ. In our community, we hold Word Sharing Circle regularly which provides us an opportunity to reflect on His word and to apply His message in our daily life. Jesus speaks to us through the magisterium

which gives us spiritual lessons; Jesus speaks to us through the different sacraments especially the Holy Eucharist that makes His presence felt profoundly; the sacrament of reconciliation that heals our brokenness and brings us spiritual healing. At times, our God uses people around us as His messengers. We need to converse with Jesus through prayers and we cannot overemphasize to set aside time to make prayers a regular part of our lives. Tending the Flock

Listen and Follow

The Liturgy of the Fourth Sunday of Easter presents to us one of the most beautiful images that has portrayed the Lord Jesus since the earliest centuries of the Church: the Good Shepherd. The Gospel of St. John, in chapter 10, describes the special features of the relationship between Christ the Good Shepherd and his flock, a relationship so close that no one will ever be able to snatch sheep from his hand. Indeed, the sheep are united to him by a bond of love and of reciprocal knowledge, which guarantees to them the immeasurable gift of eternal life.

At the same time, the flock's attitude to the Good Shepherd, Christ, is presented by the Evangelist with two specific verbs: "to listen" and "to follow". These terms suggest the fundamental characteristics of those who live out the following of the Lord.

First of all by listening to his word, from which faith is born and by which it is nurtured. Only those who are attentive to the Lord's voice can assess in their own conscience the right decisions for acting in accordance with God. Thus the following of Jesus derives from listening: we act as disciples only after hearing and inwardly accepting the Master's teachings in order to put them into practice every day.

Spirit prompts our conscience as a way of guiding our actions. Jesus love, self-giving, mercy, sacrifice and faithfulness.


In return, we speak to Him when we counsel the doubtful, instructing the ignorant who our God is. We become the bearers of the Good News. As children of God, we admonish the sinners and we try our best to bring them into conversion into a new life as he enters the gate. Jesus wants us to reach out to those who are sorrowful, to forgive those who have injured us and to bear with one another.

The Good Shepherd promises to lead his people to safety and warns us to be cautious about who we follow. We need to be careful of those around

us who could be thieves and robbers of our souls. Listening and following talks about forgiveness, unconditional Christ entails some suffering and sacrifices as shepherds lay their lives for their lambs. We are strengthened for this task through the baptism and the Holy Spirit dwelling in us. And we can always find comfort in our Good Shepherd who suffered for us.

> All of us are called to be shepherds and gates through conversion like what St. Peter says in the first reading "Repent and be baptized." The invitation of the Good Shepherd is to join Him in his mission for others to walk through the gate that stands open before us. Jesus is risen and He came so that we might have life and have it more abundantly (Jn 10:10).
