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Uncompromising But Patient

REFLECTION:

Lent is the season when we commemorate the passion, death and resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ, for the salvation of man. It is a manifestation of God's great love to fulfill His promised redemption of mankind. We are there-

fore exhorted to make Christ's death on the cross meaningful in our life, to be constantly aware that we are the beneficiaries of His great sacrifice.

The saving power of Christ's death on the cross has purified us from all our iniquities and transgressions, and we have to persevere in our Christian faith to preserve a state of grace within us. We have to sustain a conscious effort to nurture our spirit and courageously preserve the purity of our heart as we are constantly imperiled by worldly temptations in our daily life. A weak spirit is prone to yield to tests that leads to sin. When overcome by sinfulness, we are hindered from having a joyful and inspired spirit which makes it difficult for us to be fruitful wit-

nesses of Christ's mercy and compassion. We are also drawn away from the loving presence of God.

Jesus commands us to repent and He tells us as well the consequence if we do not (cf Lk 13:3, 5). As we yield to His command, we be-

come reconciled with Him through the Sacrament of Penance, in sincerely confessing our sins to the priest. True repentance is to completely surrender ourselves from our wrongdoing, change our mind and heart, and turn away from everything that displeases God, through the enabling power of the Holy Spirit. "If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just and will forgive us our sins and purify us from all unrighteousness," (1 Jn 1:9). We are enjoined to go to confession and receive the Sacrament regularly, to guard our heart and remain steadfast in fulfilling our obligations as faithful disciples.
