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# **Called To Bear Fruit**

#### **REFLECTION:**

In St. Matthew's account of the Parable of the Sower, God reveals his other true nature: generosity and benevolence. His generosity is boundless and covers all his people, whether they obey his Word or accept Jesus as Lord and Savior. He knows that, sooner or later, the heart that refused, rejected or abandoned Him will ultimately change, turn away from sin and return to Him once they open, read, reflect and understand what

he has written, because his Word "...is living and effective, sharper than any twoedged sword, penetrating even between soul and spirit, joints and marrow, and able to discern reflections and thoughts of the heart." (Heb 4: 12).

Jesus' teaching in our gospel readings compares the condition of the human heart to the different kinds of soil especially how it accepts His Word and how it responds. Like fertile soil, He reminds us how we



should allow His Word to grow, enrich our lives and the lives of others. It tells us how we should live our faith and how we should act according to His teachings and the church. Simply said, our words and actions should not only be pleasing to our God but must also be the true reflection of who He is. As followers of Christ, we are called to be true witnesses of the Gospel, proclaiming and acting on the message that the Lord wants to convev to our brothers and sisters, inside and outside

of the community. Indeed, we are called to bear fruit in His vineyard by bringing more families and friends back to the faith, to the church and our community. Then, we can truly say: God's word "...shall not return to Him void but shall do His will, achieving the end for which He sent it."

As disciples and members of His covenant community, the Lord reminds us to remain faithful to the covenant and

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## **Fair-Weather Christianity**

Let us look, as from a broader perspective, at what it means to be Flock on the road. In a way, every road is hardened and foolish on account of the fact that it lies beneath everyone's feet. They will not preserve their faith in this way, if in times of tumultuous persecution their soul is not prepared for the struggle.
