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
A Deeper Communion

REFLECTION:

Our theme for the 6th Sunday of Easter tells us that the way to the Father is to love Jesus by keeping and obeying His commandments. We are encouraged to love Him deeply and to obey Him more faithfully by relying upon His power in our lives. The deeper our

intimacy with Jesus, the greater will be His impact on our lives and our ability to spread His word. An intimate relationship with Jesus leads to a devoted and joyful obedience.

In our Sunday Gospel reading, Jesus revealed biblical principles to guide His disciples towards deeper communion of life and love with him. These principles are timely guides for us in the BLD Community as we chart our way forward from internal and external difficulties, past and present, that beset us, towards our vision of building a more vibrant, enduring BLD communion and an abundantly fruitful global mission empowered by the Holy Spirit.



The first principle is articulated in the introduction to our worship theme: Obedience and love go together; obedience is a proof of love, a fruit and effect of love. We glean this from the statement of Jesus, "If you love me, you will keep my commandments," (Jn 14:15) wherein the Lord une-

quivocally predicates our obedience to our love for Him, for His commandment is the commandment of love for God, others and self.

The Catechism of the Catholic Church states that "to obey in faith is to submit freely to the word that has been heard, because its truth is guaranteed by God, who is Truth itself" (CCC144). "By faith, man completely submits his intellect and his will to God. With his whole being man gives his assent to God the revealer" (CCC143). Obedience is not a limitation of freedom, but by our obedience to God, we become sharers in the redemptive grace won by Christ, bringing us to the freedom as sons and daughters of God who partake

With the strength of the Holy Spirit, Philip and the other disciples accomplished in the villages of Palestine what Jesus had done: They preached the Good News and worked miraculous signs. It was the

Lord who acted through them. As Jesus proclaimed the coming of the Kingdom of God, so the disciples proclaimed the Risen Jesus, professing that he is the Christ, the Son of God, baptizing in his name and driving out every illness of body and spirit.

"There was much joy in that city". Reading this passage, one thinks spontaneously of the healing power of the Gospel, which throughout the centuries has "watered" so many populations, like a beneficent river. Several great men and women saints brought hope and peace to entire cities — we think of Charles Borromeo in Milan at the time of the plague, of Bl. Mother Teresa of Calcutta, and of so many missionaries, whose names are known by God, who have given their lives to bring the proclamation of Christ and make profound joy flower among men. While the powers of this world sought to conquer new territories for political and economic interests, Christ's messengers went everywhere with

The Compass



in His divine life.

Regarding obedience to our leaders, our obedience to leadership is founded on our love of God, by whose authority leaders are chosen and given the responsibility and accountability to watch over the Lord's flock. We obey our leaders, because together with them, we have been entrusted with and participate in the work of the Lord (cf. Heb 13:17).

The second biblical principle is: Love supports obedience; in turn, obedience begets love. Jesus promised, "And I will ask the Father, and he will give you another Advocate to be with you always, the Spirit of truth, whom the world cannot accept, because it neither sees nor knows him. But you know him, because he remains with you, and will be in you...." (Jn 14:16-17). The Holy Spir-

it, God's gift of love, is our Comforter, Eucharist, Jesus is present to us no Teacher and Defender. The Holy Spirit will teach and remind us of the sacrificial love of Christ and empower us to respond to that pure and unconditional love by loving and being present to one another, just as Christ loved His Church and His disciples. Jesus gave us the Holy Spirit to be the energy and staying power in our life of faith.

The third biblical principle is: Through our obedience, God fortifies our communion and mission with His presence and empowerment. Jesus promised: "I will not leave you orphans; I will come to you,"(Jn 14:18). Jesus keeps this promise of eternal life to us in the Holy Eucharist where He comes to us in His risen presence to be our strength and continuing spiritual sustenance. In the

matter what situation or circumstance we may face. "The world will no longer see me, but you will see me, because I live and you will live," (Jn 14:19). The Lord promises that those who love and obey Him will have a clean heart and they are blessed for they will see God (cf. Mt 5:8). Moreover, just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, those who love and obey Him will live in newness of life (cf. Rom 6:4). By our love and obedience, the world will see God's living presence in our community.

To faithfully obey the Lord's commandments, we need to commit ourselves to knowing Jesus more, to following His teachings, thus allowing the Holy Spirit to transform us into Christ's likeness.
