REFLECTION:

"My sheep hear my voice; I know them, and they follow me."

Do we really hear God's voice? Is it really God's voice or your own voice?

In our daily

life, we encounter different circumstances that will test our faith. And each time we are in that situation, our dear shepherd calls us to come to Him. But do we hear Him? There are many different voices, and these voices can affect us in our daily basis of life. Ideally, we follow His voice by praying, meditating on the word of God to build a habit of hearing Him speaking to us. We surely make time to value unnecessary things in life, but do we make time to value God's voice? God comes on a prepared atmosphere. We need to set an appointment to dialogue with Him.

The bible describes Jesus as our great Shepherd. Those of us who have



surrendered our lives to Him are like sheep in His flock. The Shepherd spends his entire waking hours caring and tending to the flock. Jesus is our caring Shepherd who guards and guides us, who

feeds us and tends us, who protects us and loves us and who intimately knows each of His own by name.

We are all His sheep, and we are called to be his disciples. And we all know that serving Him brings inner joy in our inmost being. But why then we repeatedly fail to follow Him? Mark Of The Sheep

The mark of Christ's sheep is their willingness to hear and obey, just as disobedience is the mark of those who are not his. We

take the word hear to imply obedience to what has been said. People who hear God are known by him. No one is entirely unknown by God, but to be known in this way is to become part of his family. Therefore, when Christ says, Tknow mine, he means I will receive them and give them a permanent mystical relationship with myself. It might be said that inasmuch as he has become man, he has made all human beings his relatives, since all are members of the same race. We are all united to Christ in a mystical relationship because of his incarnation. Yet those who do not preserve the likeness of his holiness are alienated from him... "My sheep follow me," says Christ. By a certain God-given grace, believers follow in the footsteps of Christ. No longer subject to the shadows of the law, they obey the commands of Christ and guided by his words rise through grace to his own dignity, for they are called 'children of God' (Mt 5:9).
