
A Covenant Of Love

REFLECTION:

The theme for the sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time is - We are the salt and the light of the earth when we obey and teach God's commandments and walk in His ways. God gave us His commandments as our guide that will lead us to His kingdom because He loves us unconditionally. His commands are specific to make it easy for us to understand. We have to make sure that we know all of them by heart and more importantly follow them in

everything we think, say and do. The Lord will surely be delighted when we strive to remain faithful and obedient to the law that He has crafted for us. By obeying His commands we are directed to walk in His pathways.

In the Gospel, Jesus said that He has come not to abolish the law but to fulfill it. He came to establish a new covenant. It is not a list of do's and don'ts, but a call to "holiness that surpasses that of the scribes and Pharisees." The new covenant spells



out the relationship of God and His people bound by love. In Jeremiah 31: 33 -34. He said, "This is the covenant which I will make with the house of Israel after those days, says the Lord. I will place my law within them, and I will write it upon their hearts; I will be their God, and they shall be my people. No longer will they have need to teach their friends and kinsmen how to know the Lord. All, from the least to the greatest, shall know me, says the Lord, for I will forgive their evildoing

and remember their sin no more."

This is a more inspiring and compassionate covenant that the Lord has offered to us compared to the original Mosaic Law. The covenant of love is simplified into the greatest commandments: "Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind. Love your neighbor as yourself." Since these commandments have been etched in our hearts, the Spirit of the Lord provides the guidance we need as we apply them in our

Love Is The Fulfilling Of The Law

And addressing his disciples, he adds: "unless your righteousness exceeds that of the Scribes and Pharisees, you will never enter the Kingdom of Heaven" (Mt 5:17,20). But what do this "fullness" of Christ's Law and this "superior" justice that he demands consist in?

Jesus explains it with a series of antitheses between the old commandments and his new way of propounding them. He begins each time: "You have heard that it was said to the men of old...", and then he asserts: "but I say to you".... For example, "You have heard that it was said to the men of old, 'you shall not kill; and whoever kills shall be liable to judgment'. But I say to you that everyone who is angry with his brother shall be liable to judgment" (Mt 5:21-22).

And he does this six times. This manner of speaking made a great impression on the people, who were shocked, because those words: "I say to you" were equivalent to claiming the actual authority of God, the source of the Law. The newness of Jesus consists essentially in the fact that he himself "fulfils" the commandments with the love of God, with the power of the Holy Spirit who dwells within him. And we, through faith in Christ, can open ourselves to the action of the Holy Spirit who makes us capable of living divine love.

So it is that every precept becomes true as a requirement of love, and all join in a single commandment: love God with all your heart and love your neighbor as yourself. "Love is the fulfilling of the Law", St. Paul writes (Rom 13:10).




Looking Forward
