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Be Salt And Light To Others

REFLECTION:

In this Sunday's readings, our Lord directly instructs us, His disciples, to be salt of the earth and to be light to the world. How are we to accomplish this? The Lord is asking us to do this through concrete actions, not merely through prayers but through works. He states in the Gospel: "Your light must shine before others, that they may see your good deeds and glorify your Heavenly Father" (Mt 5:16).

The first reading from Isaiah, in a very detailed

way, tells what kind of good works will please and give glory to our Lord. We are to share our bread with the hungry, shelter the oppressed and the homeless, clothe the naked and not turn our back on our own.

Corporal and spiritual works of mercy is clearly being asked of us by our Lord. One of the ways to answer the Lord's challenge is by making an effort to actively participate in our BLD community's mission activities such as Gawad Kalinga events, Medical Mission or soup kitchen volunteer assignments.

Aside from helping those with physical and material needs, we are also asked to "not turn our back on our own". The Lord asks us to be salt and light to our own immediate families and members of our BLD family, specially when they need encouragement or need empowerment and need reminding that they have spiritual gifts that they can share within the family and

with our community.

When we come before others as we do our Lord's work, we may feel hesitant because we have our imperfections and weaknesses; we may feel inadequate. However, the second reading from St. Paul states "Let your faith rest not on human wisdom but on the power of God." If we go forth with faith and the conviction that we are doing what the Lord desires of

Give A New Taste To The World

Salt, in the cultures of the Middle East, calls to mind several values such as the Covenant, solidarity, life and wisdom. Light is the first work of God the Creator and is a source of life; the word of God is compared to light, as the Psalmist proclaims: "Your word is a lamp to my feet and a light to my path" (Ps 119[118]:105).

And, again in today's Liturgy, the Prophet Isaiah says: "If you pour your-self out for the hungry and satisfy the desire of the afflicted, then shall your light rise in the darkness and your gloom be as the noonday" (58:10).

Wisdom sums up in itself the beneficial effects of salt and light: in fact, disciples of the Lord are called to give a new "taste" to the world and to keep it from corruption with the wisdom of God, which shines out in its full splendor on the Face of the Son because he is "the true light that enlightens every man" (Jn 1:9).

United to him, in the darkness of indifference and selfishness, Christians can diffuse the light of God's love, true wisdom that gives meaning to human life and action.

Self-Sharing

Spiritual accompaniment, if it is docile to the Holy Spirit, helps to unmask misunderstandings, even grave ones, in our consideration of ourselves and our relationship with the Lord. The Gospel presents various examples of clarifying and liberating conversations with Jesus. Think, for example, of those with the Samaritan woman, which we read and read, and there is always this wisdom and tenderness of Jesus; think of the one with Zacchaeus, think of the sinful woman, think of Nicodemus, and the disciples of Emmaus: the Lord's way of approaching. The people who had a true encounter with Jesus were not afraid to open their hearts, to present their own vulnerability, their own inadequacy, their own fragility. In this way, their self-sharing becomes an experience of

The voice of the Lord can always be recognized; it has a unique style it is a voice that pacifies, encourages and reassures in difficulties. The Gospel reminds us of this continually: "Do not be afraid" (Lk 1: 30), how beautiful is the Angel's word to Mary! "Do not be afraid", "Do not be afraid", it is the style of the Lord, "Do not be afraid". "Do not be afraid!" the Lord repeats to us today too, "Do not be afraid!" if we trust in his word, we will play the game of life well, and we will be able to help others. As the Psalm says, his Word is a lamp to our feet and a light to our path (cf. 119, 105).

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us, then those we serve will be illumined by the light and the outpouring of the Holy Spirit.



In the Gospel of Matthew, our Lord heeds us to preserve our "saltiness". He explained to His disciples, when salt loses its taste, it is no longer good for anything. Actions we can take to comply with our Lord's warning are to commit to daily prayers and study of the

Word and regularly avail of the sacraments of Reconciliation and the Holy Eucharist.

In conclusion, we offer this prayer. Lord Jesus, You ask me to render works of mercy and be salt and light to those around me. Putting this into practice is a challenge because oftentimes I am only concerned with myself.

Fill my heart and mind with your truth and light. Free me from the blindness of self-centeredness that I may see Your ways and understand Your will for my life. Give me the grace to offer to You my whole self regularly during my prayer time, worship and service to our community mission work, all for Your greater glory, that I may radiate Your light to others in word and deed...Amen



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
