An Invitation Open To All

REFLECTION:

The parable of the wedding feast in this Sunday's gospel illustrates the point that the wedding feast is about the universal salvation and the eternal life that God has prepared for all of us. So regardless of who

we are, we are all welcome to come to the feast. Salvation is not based on one's social status, nationality, educational achievements, or popularity. It is simply open to all. So instead of refusing the invitation, like what some did in the parable, we must honor God's invitation with gratitude and enthusiasm.

According to this gospel, as the king welcomed his guests, he noticed one who was not wearing a proper wedding garment. According to tradition, it would be a dishonor to the king to refuse to wear the garment provided to the guests. Therefore, the man who was caught wearing improper clothing learned what an offense it was as he was removed from the celebration.

Just as the king provided wedding garments for his guests, God similarly provides a special garment for all of us. Our wedding

But if our intent is to honor the invitation and to really fellowship with Him in eternity, then it is our responsibility to clothe ourselves

with the provided garment of righteousness.

"Clothe yourselves with compassion, kindness, humility, gentleness, and patience" (Col 3:12), as one of our directions states.

Clothing ourselves with the garment of righteousness is not as easy as it may sound. It means living a life that is pleasing to Him. It means constant purification by dying from our old selves and turning away from our sins. It means making the Lord first in everything that we do. It means following and obeying his will.

Think of ourselves, for example, who have been part of this community for a long time. Can we honestly say that we have always worn the garments provided to us?

<u>Prisoner</u>

Jesus reminds us what happens when a person deceives him/herself into thinking that he or she does things on their own, and they forget to be grateful, they forget the real basis of life: that good comes from the grace of God, that good comes from his free gift.

When someone forgets this gratitude to God, he or she ends up no longer facing their own situation and their own limits with the joy of feeling loved and saved, but with the sad illusion of needing neither love nor salvation. That person stops letting him/herself be loved and finds him/herself a prisoner of their own greed, a prisoner to the need to have more than others, of the desire to stand out over others.

to do something for our community, we refuse, just like some of the guests in the parable. Some of us may probably think it will just cause stress or conflict with others, so we would rather do things that are more relaxing and enjoyable. As we often hear, fellowship is easy, but 'followship' is tough.

Or how about the idea that we have been coming to Praise and Worship on Fridays here at St. William, singing and praising His name, celebrating God's Good News of love and salvation for all that can be achieved by obeying his will, by being righteous. Yet, the moment that we walk out the door, our idea of righteousness in Christ is blurred by the realities of anxiety and stress from the many things that we have to do or the conflict, anger, and the temptations that we see or face outside.

And yes, before we know it, we're again being challenged about whether we want ourselves to be clothed in the ways of the world instead of the righteousness of God.

The Good News, however, is that God also provides the things that we need to have for the life that He intends for us. Through his grace, we are given a free gift through the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ. That's why, we are being asked to receive His sacraments and the grace that comes with them.

Through God's grace, we are given the strength through his Holy Spirit to put on the garment of righteousness. "I can do all things through Christ who strengthens me".

Through God's grace and Him being our shepherd, we are being guided to the right paths, so that even though we walk in the dark valley, we will be fearing no evil, for He is at our side.

While we live, all God desires for us is to clothe ourselves with the provided garment of righteousness and, by faith, we acknowledge that He will be helping us.

In the end, we must realize that our true happiness comes from knowing that God's love and grace for us are abundant and that He will always prepare a heavenly feast for us when we meet him face-to-face in his eternal kingdom. So, we have to be glad and rejoice. *Amen?*
